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## FSMB Foundation Elects Interim Officers, New Directors

Humayun Chaudhry, D.O., FACP, FSMB President and CEO, serves as the *ex officio* (non-voting) Secretary of the FSMB Foundation Board. The following individuals were elected to serve as directors on the Foundation Board:

**Leslie Burger, M.D., FACP**, of the Washington Medical Quality Assurance Commission, and **Rebecca Hafner-Fogarty, M.D., M.B.A.**, of the Minnesota Board of Medical Practice, were appointed to serve three-year terms as directors. **Gopinath Jadhav, M.D.**, of the Virginia Board of Medicine, was appointed to complete a one-year term as a director.

The Foundation Board will hold additional elections in October 2011 to fill the remaining open positions on the Board. The Foundation's bylaws were recently amended to increase the size of the Board to 11 members, reflecting the Foundation's growth and its emerging need for additional members to serve in various capacities.
