I. SUMMARY OF 2002 BOARD ACTIONS

These pages contain the Federation of State Medical Boards' Summary of 2002 Board Actions. The information in this report reflects a compilation of disciplinary actions gathered from state licensing/regulatory boards. The reader should be aware each state has differing structures and statutory authority influencing outcomes. The information contained herein should not be used to compare the performance between boards but rather as a tool to review an individual board's activity over time. The annual summary is presented with medical boards grouped by physician population size as follows: Boards with more than 15,000 physicians practicing in-state, boards with 2,000 - 15,000 physicians practicing in-state, and boards with fewer than 2,000 physicians practicing in-state. The following definitions of the column headings may help the reader understand the data provided.

Column	Heading and Definition
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|----------|---|
| A | Loss of License or Licensed Privilege: Includes revocation, suspension, surrender or mandatory retirement of license, or loss of privileges afforded by that license. |
| B | Restriction of License or Licensed Privilege: Includes probation, limitation, or restriction of license, or licensed privileges. |
| C | Other Prejudicial Actions: Modification of a physician's license, or the privileges granted by that license, that results in a penalty or reprimand, etc., to the physician. Such action is specific to the individual physician as opposed to a group of physicians (example: denial of a license due to adverse information concerning an individual as opposed to a denial based on lack of qualification that would apply to a large group of people). |
| D | Total Prejudicial Actions: The sum of Columns A, B and C. |
| E | Non-Prejudicial Actions: An action that does not result in modification or termination of a license or licensed privileges. This action is frequently administrative in nature, such as a license denial due to lack of qualification or a reinstatement following disciplinary action. |
| F | Total Actions: The sum of Columns D and E. |

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| G | Number of Physicians with Prejudicial Actions: This number refers to the total number of individual physicians against whom prejudicial actions have been taken within a jurisdiction. Because an individual physician may have two or more prejudicial actions, this number usually is less than the total number of prejudicial actions taken within a jurisdiction (Column D). Since some physicians hold licenses in more than one state, a total for Column G would not be an accurate reflection of the total number of physicians with prejudicial actions in the country because many physicians may have received prejudicial actions in all of the states where they hold a license. The total for Column G, therefore, has been purposely omitted. |
| H | Number of Physicians with Non-Prejudicial Actions: This number refers to the total number of individual physicians against whom non-prejudicial actions have been taken within a jurisdiction. Because an individual physician may have two or more non-prejudicial actions, this number usually is less than the total number of non-prejudicial actions taken within a jurisdiction (Column E). Since some physicians hold licenses in more than one state, a total for Column H would not be an accurate reflection of the total number of physicians with non-prejudicial actions in the country because many physicians may have received non-prejudicial actions in all of the states where they hold a license. The total for Column H, therefore, has been purposely omitted. |
| I | Total Number of Physicians with Actions: This number refers to the total number of individual physicians against whom any type of actions have been taken within a jurisdiction. This number is not always equal to the sum of Columns G and H, because an individual physician receiving both a prejudicial and a non-prejudicial action in a jurisdiction is not counted twice. Since some physicians hold licenses in more than one state, a total for Column I would not be an accurate reflection of the total number of physicians with actions in the country because many physicians may have received actions in all of the states where they hold a license. The total for Column I, therefore, has been purposely omitted. |
| J | Total Number of Licensed Physicians: Refers to the total number of physicians who have been licensed to practice within a specific jurisdiction. Because not all physicians who are licensed to practice within a jurisdiction actually practice within that jurisdiction, this number is usually greater than the Number of Physicians Practicing In-State (Column K). Since some physicians hold licenses in more than one state, a total for Column J would not be an accurate reflection of the total number of licensed physicians in the country because many physicians would be counted more than once. The total for Column J, therefore, has been purposely omitted. |

I. SUMMARY OF 2002 BOARD ACTIONS - Continued

Column	Heading and Definition
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K	Total Number of Licensed Physicians Practicing In-State: Refers to the total number of physicians who are actually practicing within a specific jurisdiction. Because not all physicians who are licensed to practice within a jurisdiction actually practice within that jurisdiction, this number is usually less than the Total Number of Licensed Physicians (Column J).
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L - O	These four columns contain ratios derived from the data in the preceding columns. Although the ratios may be used individually, they are primarily used to calculate the Composite Action Index (Column P).
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P	Composite Action Index: The Composite Action Index (CAI) is the arithmetic mean of the four ratios provided in Columns L - O. Each of the four ratios offers a useful and interesting measure of activity within a jurisdiction. However, to depend on any one as a definite measure would be to ignore significant variables represented in the others. Therefore, the Federation has created the CAI to combine the four ratios into a single composite ratio for each board. This simple device, the CAI, permits relevant variables to contribute in a balanced way to a final figure that can be useful in measuring an individual board's disciplinary activity over time.

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II. COMPOSITE ACTION INDICES REPORT

As stated previously, the Composite Action Index is an index variable which averages the four ratios found in Columns L - O in the Summary of Board Actions. The CAI is not only a measure of overall activity within a board, but also is useful as a measure of change in activity over time within a specific board. It must be noted, however, that it is not statistically valid to use the CAI to compare one board's activity level with that of another in any given year. The following chart—Composite Action Indices Report—lists the composite action index for each reporting board for the years 1993 through 2002.
