

## **International Medical Graduates GME Requirements**

Board-by-Board Overview

- 24 boards (encompassing 21 jurisdictions) grant at least <u>some</u> credit to applicants who have completed GME in countries outside of the U.S. or Canada
  - o 7 boards (encompassing 6 jurisdictions) allow physicians who have completed GME outside the US/Canada to be licensed without the need to complete any additional GME
  - o 13 of the above boards (encompassing 13 jurisdictions) allow for <u>reduced</u> U.S./Canadian GME so long as the IMG is specialty board certified, licensed in another state, or both
- 43 boards (encompassing 33 jurisdictions) do not accept GME completed outside of the U.S. or Canada
